1. Supporting and approving the former "Montezuma Creek Sewing Plant" to be repurposed into a Community Multi-Purpose Building.

Motion was made by Mr. Norman Sam and was second Ms. Rebecca Benally to support and approve the former "Montezuma Creek Sewing Plant" to be repurposed into a Community Multi-Purpose Building.

The building will provide the needs in the community to facilitate it as a computer lab, recreation, after-school activities, childcare daycare, community garden, etc.

The old skeletal structure nearby was at Halchita before and over the years, the EPA and health services have conducted many assessments and it has passed each time. It is not contaminated with radiation as suspected. The structure has been dismantled and removed. The final assessment of the location shows no significant of contamination and is safe for any future developments.

Motion was made by Mr. Norman Sam and was second by Ms. Rebecca Benally to Oppose the Trump Administration 2019 Federal Budget that defunds the Navajo CHR/Outreach Program is respectfully requesting full funding of the CHR/Outreach program for to continue and maintain direct service of health care delivery to elderly and disabled Navajo people.

Red Mesa Chapter community is being served by the CHR Outreach Program and serves a significant number of high-risk people living in the community. They serve as liaisons between patients and health care providers.

5. Motion was made by Ms. Rebecca Benally and was second by Mr. Norman Sam to amend the AGENDA to add on a request to NTUA to do a feasibility study for a 3-phase line for the new Administration building.
